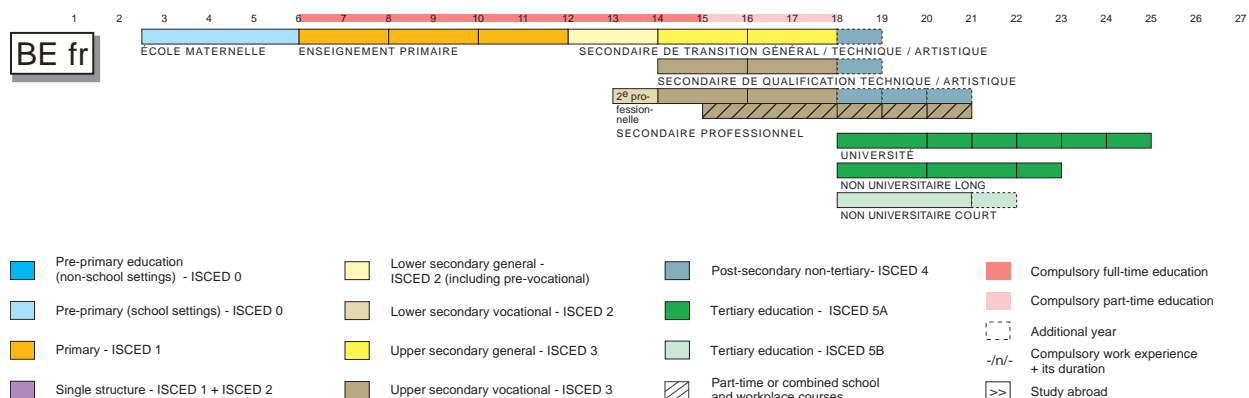

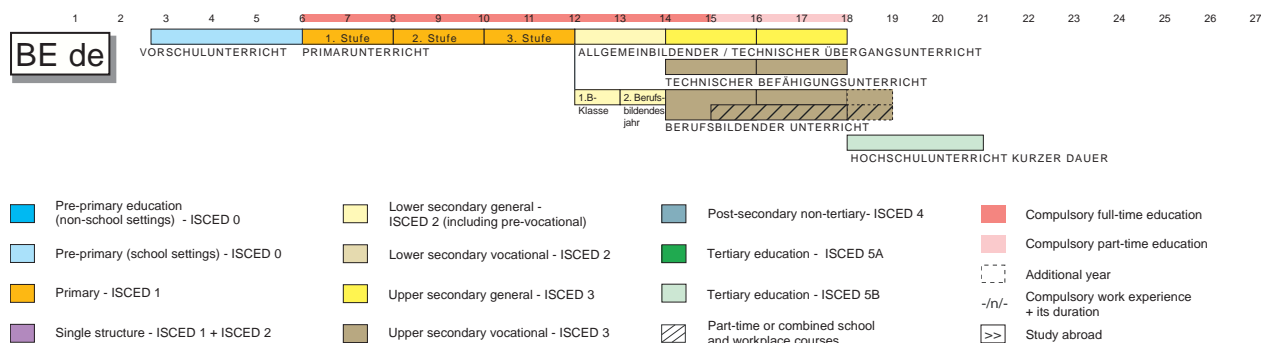
The education systems in Europe: structure of mainstream school and tertiary education ⁱ
